Commander's Column

Fellow Legionnaires, Post employees, Auxiliary, SAL members and guests; this is my final column as Commander of Minneapolis/ Richfield



Minneapolis/ Richfield Post 435. I've enjoyed getting to know each of you over the last three years. I appreciate the hard work and dedication that everybody has shown.

As I prepare to leave office, I would just like to make one final appeal to those of you out there who do not or rarely participate in the club programs and activities: *Begin getting involved!* This is your club just as much as it is anybody else's club. Over the last several years that I have been on the Executive Committee and as Commander, our membership has dropped from over 2,200 to just over 1,750. That's a decrease of just over 20%. If the rate at which we continue to lose members remains steady, we at be at less than 200 members in just 10 years.

Minneapolis/Richfield Post 435 has been around for almost 90 years. In order to continue, we need to attract the Lebanon, Grenada, Gulf War, and the veterans of Iraq and Afghanistan.

The mission of the Post is the four pillars of the American Legion:

- Veteran's Affairs and Rehabilitation
- National Security
- Americanism
- Children and Youth

We are about helping veterans and our community through local programs, Post fund raisers, and volunteering our time. One of the reasons I joined the Legion was to personally be involved in giving back to the community. Volunteerism at our Post is quite low considering the number of members we have. I would like to see this increase. This is how we as an organization give back to the community and veterans. It is about *service*.

We also need to begin to slow or reverse the trend in decreased membership over the last several years. Attracting the 25–45 age group of veterans is key to our survival. Handing out free one-year memberships or inviting people for an open house isn't going to work. We need to radically change our infrastructure and how we communicate in order to attract these veterans. Other veterans groups have a big advantage in that they have embraced newer technologies in order to get these veterans involved. This will be the challenge moving forward.

Two Juniors Represent Post 435 Gun Club at 2012 National Junior Olympic Rifle Championships

In April Minnesota sent five junior shooters to the National Junior Olympic Rifle Championships held at the US. Olympic Training Center in Colorado Springs, Colorado. Among the five were two members of Post 435 Gun Club's CMP Junior program—Elizabeth Ewert and Patrick Sunderman.

Elizabeth represented Minnesota in the Junior Women's Air Rifle Championship where female shooters shoot 8 targets from the standing position over the course of two days for a total possible 800 points. Elizabeth shot a 752, placing her 6th in the J3 age category and 64th overall.

Patrick represented the State in both Junior Men's Air Rifle and Smallbore Rifle competitions. In Air Rifle the Junior Men shoot 12 targets from the standing position over the course of two days for a possible 1200 points. Patrick posted an 1174 for 3rd place, securing a spot in the final shoot-off, to which only the top 8 competitors advance. In the final, Patrick shot a score of 98.9 giving him a total of 1272.9 and 4th overall out of 101 competitors in the event.

In Junior Men's Smallbore, Patrick was the only Minnesotan who qualified for the event, which consists of shooting from the Prone, Standing and Kneeling positions. Patrick overcame unexpected adversity when he found the bolt of his Feinwerkbau .22 rifle had been broken during the flight to Colorado and in turn rendering his rifle useless for the competition. Luckily, Patrick had a bolt shipped overnight next day from another local junior shooter. Patrick posted a score of 1176 out of 1200 in the Prone competition giving him a 12th place finish in his J1 age category, and 15th overall of 61 total competitors.

In Junior Men's 3-position competition Patrick posted a 2305 out of a possible 2400, placing him 5th in his age category, and 5th overall, again securing a spot in the final shoot-off of the top 8 competitors. In the 3-Position final Patrick scored a 91.6 for a total of 2396.6 holding his 5th place overall for the competition.
