



Scholarships are available through the Department of MN. American Legion Auxiliary

Department of MN Scholarship: This is given to a son or daughter, grandson or granddaughter of a veteran in the amount of \$1,000

A candidate must be:

- A. A resident of the State of MN or a member of the American Legion Auxiliary, the American Legion or SAL Department of MN.
- B. A high school senior or graduate, with a good scholastic record and average of at least "C".
- C. In need of and deserving of financial assistance.
- D. Of good character, with ambition to continue his/her education.

Applications must be submitted to the Unit President by March 5th and forwarded by the Unit to Department by March 15th.

American Legion Auxiliary Spirit of Youth Scholarship for Junior Members:

Candidates for this award shall be/shall have been Junior members of the American Legion Auxiliary; said member to have held Junior membership in the American Legion Auxiliary for the past three years and must hold a membership; card for the current (2011) year. Applicant must continue her membership during the four-year scholarship period. Applicants must present the completed application packet to the Unit President on or before March 1, 2011, and must be to the Department no later than April 1, 2011.

American Legion Auxiliary National President's Scholarship;
