Greetings from the 2014-2015 Officers of the Post 435 American Legion Family; The American Legion, The American Legion Auxiliary, The Sons of the American Legion, and the American Legion Riders.

In the past year, Post 435's Charitable Gambling Operation has experienced a serious audit and investigation by the State of Minnesota Gambling Control Board, which has uncovered various inconsistencies.

This investigation uncovered information that has thus far led to one former Gambling Employee facing a number of felony criminal charges in Hennepin County Court.

Reminder, these are criminal charges that will ultimately be resolved by the Court.

In addition to the criminal matter, Post 435's Charitable Gambling License has been revoked by the Gambling Control Board for a period of one year. After one year the Post may be eligible to reapply for a new Charitable Gambling license.

Thankfully our members and guests will still be able to enjoy Charitable Gambling at Post 435 during this time, as VFW Post 5555 will operate Charitable Gambling at Post 435 for at least the next 12 months.

First off, let's state how much it saddens us, to make the charitable work that we do so much more difficult. We need to also stress that this investigation and resulting action by the State of Minnesota, in no way reflects on the membership, remaining staff and charitable work at Post 435.

We ARE the American Legion Family. WE are here for those serving, those who have served, the families, and our community. Our mission has not changed. While this may slow us down, it will not stop us. We will continue our charitable work.

This next year will have many challenges however. We are not the first or last Post to deal with challenge and adversity. Actions will be taken to ensure this can never happen again. With hard work, cooperation of our membership, staff, and guests, we will endeavor to rise out of this time of difficulty, a stronger more resilient organization.

Suffice it to say, this is a very critical event in our Post's history. At this time we need ALL Legion Family members' help and support to ensure Post 435 survives and thrives into the future
