Statement from the Commander

The Richfield American Legion Post 435 has a long tradition of charitable giving and service to our community. Our Post is proud to support Veteran's and Community Charities.

The Minnesota Gambling Control Board revoked our Gambling License for one year in May of 2014, after the discovery of a very large amount of money missing from the Charitable Gambling account. The loss we have suffered is tremendous. The missing money should have gone to charities helping veterans and our community.

The State requirements for Post 435 to apply for a gambling license before the year 2024, are stringent and very clear. The Gambling Control Board required us to reimburse the missing \$200,000.00 into the Gambling account, and then distribute all the funds to charities. This process has been extremely painful, time consuming, and tremendously difficult to manage and implement.

We have worked closely with the good people at the Gambling Control Board, cooperating fully with all their requirements, nearing completion by distributing the money, thus closing this chapter of our Post's history.

We will be allowed to apply for a Gambling License when our obligations are complete, and begin a new chapter of charitable giving in support of veterans and our community.

The former, longtime trusted bookkeeper of Charitable Gambling recently plead guilty to seven felony counts of theft by swindle. Thus explaining what happened to the missing money, and finally allowing us to move forward.

We have made great strides forward this year, and I am proud, excited, and looking forward to being part of this new chapter of Post 435.
