Air Rifle Team Wins Silver!

"Post 435 X-Men" Junior Air Rifle team was again on the podium at the Jr. Olympics Air Rifle National Championships on June 25th. The competition was held at the state of the art CMP facility in Aniston, Alabama. After winning the Bronze in 2010 and 2011, the Sporter Air Rifle Team earned Silver this year with a score of 4246, just 11 points from first place in the club category. The 2012 team was comprised of the same four members as last year—Courtney L'Heureux (2012 State Champion), Nick Skrogstad (2012 Silver Medalist), Elizabeth Ewert (2012 State Sub-Jr. Champion), and Connor Dupey. 



SONS OF THE AMERICAN LEGION
