

This summer I was honored to represent Post 435 and the state of Minnesota at the US National Rifle Matches which are held annually at Camp Perry in Ohio.

For those who don't know, Camp Perry is a Ohio National Guard base established in 1906. It was named in honor of Commodore Oliver Hazard Perry, the commander of the victorious American forces who defeated the British in the Battle of Lake Erie in 1813. The National Matches were established in 1903 and have been held annually at Camp Perry since 1907.

The National Matches are a series of Small Arms Firing Schools (SAFS), National Trophy Matches and CMP (Civilian Marksmanship Program) Games Matches. Some of the best competitive shooters, both military and civilian, from all over the world make the pilgrimage every year to compete.

The most prestigious trophy match is the President's Rifle Match. It was first fired in 1878 and was incorporated into the National Match program in 1903 when the National Matches were established. This 30 shot match consists of 3 stages. 10 shots fired from the standing position at 200 yards, 10 shots fired in 70 seconds from a prone position at 300 yards and finally 10 shots fired from a prone position at 600 yards. This year there were 1,073 entrants.

The shooters finishing in the top 100 places make the cut to become the "President's Hundred". As you can imagine there is fierce competition for this highly sought after award.

While I've shot this match for years, I've always found a way to take myself out of competition. This was the first year I managed to put 3 solid stages together, only dropping 8 points over the course of the match, placing me in 48th place overall and earning my first President's Hundred honor.

I feel blessed to be counted among the finest group of patriots and my Post 435 family members.
