(**Centennial from Page 6**) which was turned over to the MN Highway Patrol, who turned to the American Legion to help with the program. The American Legion provided a permanent location for this camp at Legionville, a 610 acre wood camp with 1,500 foot shoreline along North Long Lake near Brainard.

- SPAM American Legion Post 570 is an all female veteran post, formed by WWII veterans.
- The American Legion Family Hospitalization Fund can trace its roots to August 1922 when veterans from around the country came to Rochester to be treated.
- Drs. Charles and William Mayo are charter members of the William T. McCoy American Legion Post 92 in Rochester.
- Post 435 sponsored the first American Legion Baseball team from MN who
 won the national Championship. It was in 1943 and the teams picture is on
 the front page. Only 5 teams from MN have won the national championship.

Did you know?

- Minnesota is the home of the First American Legion Convention held in 1919? The next National convention will be held in Minneapolis in August 2018.
- In the first five years after its founding in MN, The American Legion helped build and dedicate nearly 50 memorials to the Great War (WWI) statewide.
- The first American Legion Junior Baseball Tournament was played in 1926 in Mankato, and Crosby takes the championship.
- The Fort Snelling Chapel is dedicated in 1928 after MN Legionnaires raise \$28,000 to build it.
- In 1929, the Legion promotes a statewide campaign to put signs in every community warning drivers to watch out for children. The signs are created at a disabled veterans workshop, run by The American Legion and The American Legion Auxiliary in Minneapolis.
- The School Patrol Safety Camp was begun in 1921 in St. Paul, (Continued on Page 5)
