In August, up to 100,000 Legionnaires from Posts across the world will be coming to Minneapolis to celebrate our 100th Anniversity. Our Post has been actively working to make it a successful time. I have met with and been on the telephone with those soliciting the use of our Club to be the location for other Departments parties. We have commitments for five large celebrations at the Post, so our Post will be a busy place. Our Club has offered them a wonderful location with food and drink at a reasonable price but enough cost where we will make a profit. It has been a personally rewarding experience to be able to help and to meet my fellow Legionnaires but keeping my Fiduciary responsibility as my mantra during this process.

There are plans in the progress to make physical improvements to our building that will freshen up our appearance as well as make some functional changes. Solicitations to major corporations have been made to ask them to help us in this venture. Our Second Vice Commander, Casey Ludwig, has plans to involve the use of qualified volunteers for a few of the projects.

Our Memorial Day Observance will continue with our traditional service at Oak Hill Cemetery. Usually we return to the Post and have a meal of hotdogs and beans. This year I am making solicitations to corporations for donations to enable us to offer a better menu than our traditional fare for our Veterans.

While reviewing our invoices and financial records along with signing the checks every week, I found an area where we would increase our profit margins. The Post's Manager has been moving us very effectively towards building the food side of our business. If you haven't met our Club Manager Rich I encourage you to stop by and talk with him.

Rich is a pleasure to work with for he is a Manager that can make things happen.

When Rich first started at the Post I told him about our under-utilized auditorium and the potential to make it a profit center. Rich has been working hard by adding banquets of one to three hundred people and working on the menu exploring better food selections while developing profitability. So far this year the Post we have sold 700 pounds of fish, and 1720 pounds of Broasted Chicken. Also, there will be a new menu very soon.

Working with Rich we have been able to identify ways for the Post to cut our costs

while maintaining the same level of service. Rich contacted several garbage companies and received bids to remove our garbage, so we were able to cut our bill in half resulting in savings of \$3,700. Rich contacted Excel Energy, and we have now received about \$1,900 in rebates thru an energy audit that was done.

There are more areas that we need to explore to look for additional savings.

Our First Vice Mark Barthel has been the coordinator of our Boys State program at the Post. He has located ten top notch candidates who wish to attend this year's session.

The Post continues to support Richfield Baseball and Legion Baseball. We are currently organizing a dinner and ceremony to kick off their season. More to come on that.

We now have a college Intern assisting us with our Social Media presence so you should soon be seeing an increase in our traffic in this media.

Winter into Spring brings positive change, and we are making positive changes at the Richfield Legion.

Broasted Chicken. Since the middle of January, we have sold more than 3500 pieces of chicken. We are in the process of coming out with a new menu. From what I can tell, we are using old pricing (over three years old at least) so pricing is going to be adjusted but not so much as to price us out of the market. We are putting an emphasis on Legion Food (comfort food) and some new healthier items. Removing selections

that do not move well but we have to stock since they are on the menu. For instance, instead of having to stock 3-4 different steaks, we will be serving the same steak 4 different ways and price points. We have been working in our suppliers (Sysco) test kitchen to assure that additions are something that will be popular, easy to prepare and cost effective. Watch for the new menu soon!!

It has been great working with Commander Tom. He has great business savvy and a working knowledge of facilities, bar, and restaurant cost and procedures. He can analyze things and decide in a timely manner and has been great to work with. He also has had the best interest of the Legion at heart 100% of the time and I hope he has a place after his term ends. We are lucky to have someone who "gets it" and really truly cares about the Post. And one last thing...I was impressed that even through several illnesses the past few months, Tom was never too sick to help and advise me when I had questions about the Post and past practices etc. Looking forward, this Memorial Day, we are going to feed ALL of our Veterans and their guest a proper meal. Sometimes in the heat of the battle, I can't help but think that we lose sight of the purpose of our very existence. To take care of the Vets!! The Commander and I are asking our food suppliers to donate a lot of food for the luncheon. Spread to word to any Veteran you know and tell them that they are welcome to dine after the flag ceremony on Memorial Day.

To all, lets stay focused on the Mission, to help our Veterans. To not empire build but keep the best interests of the Post forefront and take care of each other.





Its been a long cold winter and Spring is approaching!!! So just a little recap of things.

The building needed some repairs that could not be deferred. There has been very little if any preventive maintenance done on the HVAC and plumbing systems. As a result, two of the rooftop heaters needed repairs. The filters were almost completely clogged, one of them needed a PC board and the other a drive belt and over limit switch. The chemistry in the boiler unit had apparently not been checked since the new boilers were installed and as a result the heat exchanger in the south vestibule rotted through. Speaking of vestibules, the one in the main entrance was wired incorrectly. That was corrected, and it works fine. Additionally, a jockey pump for the heat exchanger in the rear of the building seized up do to corrosion in the boiler system. All of the heaters are now functional, and the boiler water monitored and corrected every 90 days. The waste water drains coming from the bar and kitchen had debris and other gunk in them. They have been cleaned out and drains working properly.

We upped the speed on our internet connection from 25 MPS to 75 and have a updated WiFi system. The new system will transfer routers when walking from the auditorium to the front seamlessly. The system is partitioned so that many multiple users will not slow down the bandwidth needed to operate our business.

Bar operations are going well. Our cost of liquor is in the low 20% range. We still have an overpouring issue but well on the way to correcting that.

Restaurant is headed in the right direction. The largest one selling item on the menu is

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
